- 2. With an attendance of forty-two, including those on the Committee, the meeting was confirmed by the notetaker as quorate.
- 3. The Agenda, Minutes of the previous AGM, the Annual Accounts and the Chairman's Annual Report had been circulated prior to the meeting.

4. **Proceedings**

TD informed the meeting that David Ryan (Acting Secretary) and Annie Mendelow are stepping down from the committee. TD thanked both for the continued hard work and presented both with a gift of thanks.

7. Garden Plan

AA confirmed all this information is available on the website also.

9. **Guest Speakers**

TD invited local councilors Andrei Czolak and Ollie Sykes to speak at the AGM. Both were very pleased with the turnout of residents and supported the Friends group.

Andrei emphasised the Councillors' availability to discuss community concerns. Highlighting the monthly Councillors' surgery on the $4^{\rm th}$ Wednesday of each month. Along with contact details by email and phone available on the new contact sheet. Along with a discussion on the new Western Road Red route and the overall community safety issues – with designated hotspot and push for further PCSO representation in the area. Emphasising the importance of recording issues so action can be taken.

Ollie recognized the work of FOPA in the community and appreciated the opportunity it provides the Councillors. Both the Councillors aim is to provide support and assistance to FOPA and its residents where possible. Assistance with financial funding for projects is limited with council budgets stretched but where possible they will assist with applications for areas such as the desire path.
